### Enterprise Ireland work on OW to date

- Focus is on Fixed in the UK market—Opportunity is immediate! 40GW between now and 2030 estimated 40,000 jobs in the industry by 2030.
- El working to get Irish capability into the UK market; events, market study visits, webinars, etc.
- Established Irish Offshore Wind Industry Cluster 55 Companies.
- Strategic Market review of UK and Scandinavian Markets, also contact from Poland and France.
- Ireland Inc heavily focused on Fixed projects in Irish Sea 3-5 years?
- El wants to maximise Local Content in that Supply Chain.











## Floating – is the SME capability transferrable?

- Much of the capability being built up is transferrable, but what can Irish Research and Industry bring to the Floating table?
- Additional requirements around Dynamic Mooring systems, etc. (Dublin Offshore Consultants, Technology from Ideas).
- Very significant Irish Capability around Comms/IoT/Connectivity this will be critical for FLOW. (Vilicom, EMR Solutions, CeADAR, VRAI).
- What other areas of capability can be brought to bear?
- Ireland needs to work with other nations to maximise return for all Scotland, wider UK, Norway, Germany. Green Hydrogen in parallel with FLOW!
